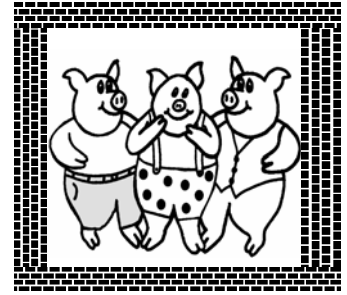


Class Wolf Stew Cookbook



Domain:

- Daily Living, Socialization

Objectives:

- Child and parent will choose a favorite recipe.
- Child will share recipe with classmates by creating a class cookbook.

Materials:

- *Class Cookbook* kettle recipe card
- Paper punch and rings or other means of binding the book

Instructions:

- Copy one *Class Cookbook* recipe card and one parent instruction letter (below) for each child.
- After recipe cards are sent and returned, punch 2 holes in the top of the kettle recipe card.
- Inset large rings to create a flipbook of recipes. (or other means of binding)

Suggestions:

- As cards are returned, make copies for each child. Create a cookbook for every child to take home and share with family members.
- Put the child's picture on the back of his/her recipe in the class cookbook.
- Have extra recipe cards with additional recipes available for children who were not able to contribute a recipe from home. Make sure all children are represented in your cookbook.
