

## My Own Puffy Spider



### Domain:

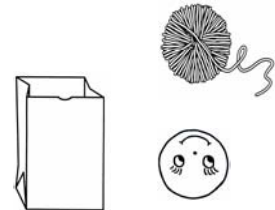
- Fine Motor, Language

### Objectives:

- Child will decorate spider bags with crayons or markers.
- Child will crumple newspaper or tissue paper.
- Child will stuff and fill spider bag.
- Child will tape or paste paper strips (legs) on the bottom of the bag.

### Materials:

- *My Own Puffy Spider* reproducible page
- One lunch sized brown paper bag per child
- Yarn, string or ribbon
- Crepe paper or paper to make strips for legs
- construction paper
- tissue paper or newspaper
- stapler/glue



### Instructions:

- Teacher will copy *My Own Puffy Spider* creating one face for each paper bag needed.
- Child will crumple tissue paper or small sections of newspaper.
- Assist child with stuffing crumpled paper into the paper bag.
- Fill until about half full.
- Tie the off the filled section with yarn or ribbon.
- Instruct children to paste spider face onto the side of the bag.
- Cut 12" long strips of crepe paper or construction paper for legs. Each puffy spider can have up to 8 legs.
- Paste or staple desired number of legs onto each bag.



### Suggestion:

- Children with advanced cutting skills should be encouraged to cut their own spider faces and strips for the legs.
