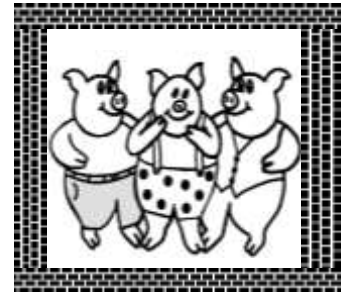


Wolf Stew Vegetable Toss



Domain:

- Gross Motor, Language, Cognitive

Objectives:

- Child will use gross motor skills to toss vegetables into large pot.
- Child will use gross motor skills to stand on footprints.
- Child will identify vegetables.

Materials:

- *Wolf Stew Footprints* reproducible page.
- kettle
- a variety of plastic vegetables (tomatoes, onion, potato, ear of corn)
- Large wooden spoon
- Piggy Headband (pp. 210)

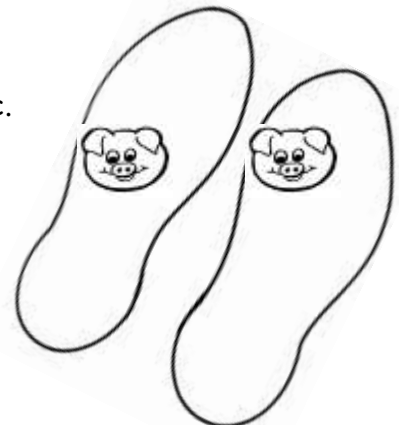


Instructions:

- Copy and cut *Wolf Stew Footprints*.
- Assemble a variety of vegetables.
- Place footprints on the floor an appropriate distance from the kettle, giving the children a place to stand.
- Demonstrate how to stand on the footprints and toss vegetables into the kettle to make "Wolf Stew".
- Allow the child to choose a vegetable.
- Identify the type of vegetable and its color.
- Instruct the child to toss the vegetable into the pot.
- Choose one child to play the part of the third little pig and stir the pot as the vegetables are added.

Suggestions:

- Real vegetable may be used in place of plastic.
- A washtub or plastic tub may be used as the cooking pot. A larger container makes an easier target.
